

PulX is a young collective based in Montpellier in the south of France since 2004. Various artists, with backgrounds in a wide range of different fields, have joined PulX to work together on innovative multi-disciplinary projects; including mainly movement, photography and music.

The artistic pieces composed by Pulx are based on a collective and mutli-disciplinary

approach with a real emphasis placed on the creative process. Pulx seeks to explore and open choreography to the new possibilities of interdisciplinary creation through the meeting of dance, the art of movement and digital art for sound and image. The pieces are first and foremost a live performance and despite the different medium used, the artistic content is never overshadowed by technology. The performances often extend beyond the limits of the stage and solicit new relationships with the public.


analysis and interaction with the live soundscape happen in 'real time'...) These exhibitions may be independent, or combined with a BIRD performance, workshops, meetings...
